Title: Photonics in Radio Astronomy

RATIONALE

"Photonics is the generation, process and manipulation of photon to achieve a certain function. With photonics we manipulate the power (loss/gain), phase, polarization and wavelength independently. For radio astronomy, it presents the advantage of low electromagnetic interference, ultra high bandwidth, without the mechanical cumbersome parts typical of radio astronomy receivers. Fiber can be used to transport radio signal (RF) allowing the complex receiver circuitry to be hosted at distant locations, with low noise figure and high dynamic range. Where does the antenna and fronted ends and the backend begins? Can we combine and beam form the response of several antennas or phase arrays? Is it better to digitize at the frontend or at the backend? The applications in real world are already inumerous, ranging from wireless networks to GPS. Fiber is also very efficient to transport data, with potentially dozens of THz available for transmission. Optical networks will be critical to performance of today's and future radio telescope networks, as is already demonstrated by e-EVN, e-Merlin, ALMA, the soon starting LOFAR and e-VLA and it will be even more so for the large Terabits/sec expected from the future facilities like the SKA. Photonics in the heart of radio astronomy receivers and networks is a natural path for development for the next advanced generation of radio astronomy experiments, with capabilities for industrial partnership."

We intend to review current trends in photonics and its use in radio astronomy applications, in receivers and signal transport. Some examples of real cutting-edge real-world examples will be provided by some industries.

Today, Aveiro is an industrial city, a hub for technology development, of commerce and services and also a centre for culture and leisure, with a burgeoning offer in various forms; cinema, theatre, art exhibitions, music, dance, the plastic arts, science, water sports, night-life ... you name it

- * Enjoy the beauty and the tranquillity of the canals and lagoon on foot, cycling or on board a beautiful Moliceiro boat:
- * Wander around the quant streets of fishermen's houses and friendly restaurants of the beira-mar old quarter of the city;
- * Discover the small treasures os Art Nouveau that dot the city;
- * Stroll around the university campus, a true open-air museum of modern Portuguese architecture;

How to reach Aveiro

By road:

From the north using the A1 motorway or from the east using the A25:

Take the A1 motorway in the direction of Lisbon. Exit the A1 in the direction of Aveiro and take the A25. From the A25 there are two exits to the city, first "Aveiro-Norte" and then some kilometers later there is "Aveiro".

From the south using the A1 motorway:

Take the A1 motorway in the direction of Porto. Exit the motorway at "Aveiro-Sul/Águeda" (exit 15) and follow the EN235 road directly to city centre.

By air:

The closest airport is Francisco Sá Carneiro international airport in Porto, located some 80 km to the north of Aveiro. Portela international airport in Lisbon is located 250 km to the south of Aveiro.

Bt train from Porto Airport

The train is the most practical means of making the journey to Aveiro. The trip between the airport and the railway station (called Porto-Campanhã), which has direct rail connections to Aveiro, can be made by taxi for around 25€ and takes around 30 minutes. A less expensive alternative to reach the train station is to use Metro. At the airport you have a metro line called "E line" or "purple line" that you can use to get to the railway station (metro stop: Campanhã) (see map). Metro trains depart from airport every 20 minutes. More information on subway prices and timetables are available at www.metrodoporto.pt. The train journey from Porto-Campanhã to Aveiro takes between 40 minutes and 1h15 (and a single ticket may cost between 2.5€ and 15€), depending on the type of train used. The train journey from Porto-Campanhã to Aveiro using the "Alfa" and "Intercidades" trains takes around 40 minutes and costs between 9€ and 13€. There are (at least) one train every hour from 6.00AM to 8.30PM.

The train journey can also be made using the suburban trains and takes around 70 minutes and costs 2.15€. There are (at least) one train every hour from 5.00AM to 1.00AM (next day).

More information on train prices and timetables are available at the Portuguese railroad company CP www.cp.pt.

Aveiro railway station is located in the centre of the city about 15 minutes walking distance or 5-minute taxi ride from the conference venue.

By car from Porto Airport

At the airport there are various car hire agencies. Follow the signs for the A1 motorway in the direction of Lisbon (there is a toll charge of around 3.5€, and can be paid in cash or with a credit/debit card). Leave the A1 at the exit for Aveiro and take the A25.

By train from Lisbon airport

The simplest way of transportation to Aveiro is by train. From the airport to Lisboa-Oriente railway station, the taxi ride takes about 10 minutes and costs around 10€. Alternatively there are buses (lines 5 and 44). The ticket can be bought on the bus for around 1€. Given the distance between Lisbon and Aveiro, it is best to use the fast train services (Alfa or Intercidades). The journey will take around 2h30 and a single ticket costs up to about 25€. There are (at least) one train every hour from 6.00AM to 9.30PM. Information on train prices and timetables are available at www.cp.pt.

By car from Lisbon Airport

There are various car-hire agencies at the airport. From the airport, follow the signs for the A1 motorway in the direction of Porto. Leave the motorway at "Aveiro-Sul/Águeda" (exit 15) and take the EN235 directly to the city centre. The toll charge for use of the motorway is around 15€ and can be paid in cash or with a debit card.

By bus from Lisbon Airport

The bus station, called Terminal Rodoviário do Arco do Cego, is on Av. Duque D'Ávila, 12. Timetables and prices can be consulted at www.rede-expressos.pt.
